Flipping your classroom is a blended learning strategy meant to provide you with more time in class for higher-order activities. Students watch a video (like the one below) of the instructional content outside of the classroom. The activities that were traditionally considered homework are done in class, thus the "flipped classroom".

## **In-class activities and assessment for the flipped classroom**

Each lesson should build or connect to the next within the sequence of the learning experience. For your flipped class, you should select just one small "constellation" of sub-topics to focus the lesson. Think in terms of the amount of time needed to cover the material and time needed for the students to really learn it through application.

### **Flipped IN-CLASS Lesson Plan Template**

In a flipped classroom, it's not enough for your students to be familiar with the provided educational content, they need to know how to apply it. Dedicate the first 10 minutes re-caping the content shown in the previous video lesson, then focus on engaging your students with an active learning strategy.

### **Blended learning vs flipped classroom - What's the difference?**
